## USGA RULES GOVERN ALL PLAY

## - LOCAL RULES -

LOCAL RULE E-5: Alternative to Stroke and Distance for Lost Ball or Out of Bounds. (E-5 applies to general play but not for tournament play.)

- When a player's ball has not been found or is known or virtually certain to be out of bounds, the player may proceed as follows:
- For two penalty strokes, the player may take relief by dropping the original ball or another ball in this relief area:
- Fairway Reference Point The point of the fairway of the hole being played that is nearest to the Ball Reference Point - the point where the original ball is estimated to have come to rest on the course or last crossed the edge of the course boundary and is not nearer to the hole than the ball reference point.
- Relief area A line from the hole through the fairway reference point and within two club-lengths to the fairway side of that line.

## ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS - RULE 16: Free relief is allowed from:

- Rock (rip rap) added along cart path edges and elsewhere in the General Area as an
  erosion control is considered an immovable obstruction or as an extension of the
  cart path.
- Landscaped or planted areas bordered or surrounded by cart paths such as the roundabout areas on holes #8 and #12 are considered an extension of the cart path.
   Decorative landscaping stones surrounding the clubhouse and other landscaped areas are considered part of the General Area and not as obstructions.
- Local Rule F-5 You are allowed to take free relief from immovable obstructions (sprinkler heads) on your line of play when the obstruction is within two club-lengths of the putting green and also within two club-lengths of your ball. You may take relief by finding the nearest point of complete relief and measuring a one club-length relief area from that point, no nearer the hole and within the general area of your lie.
   Your ball must be dropped in and come to rest in that relief area.

OUT of BOUNDS: Defined by the line between the course-side points at ground level of white lines or stakes and property walls.

- A ball that comes to rest on or beyond a road (private or public) is out of bounds, even if it comes to rest on another part of the course that is in bounds for other holes.
- The boundary to the left of hole #9 is defined by the course-side edge of the concrete cart path and curbing as defined by the white out of bounds markers.
